

HOW PROPERTY TAXES ARE CREATED



PROPERTY TAX FACTS

- Livingston Parish citizens vote to approve millages* (taxes) to pay for services.
- These millages support the 42 Taxing Districts in the parish.
- All approved millages are applied to your taxable property values.
- A mill is equal to \$1 per \$1000 of assessed taxable value.
- Maximum millages are set by voter approval.
- Taxing district officials have the discretion to levy a minimum or maximum rate. District officials can lower property taxes to the minimum as property values increase. The Parish Council or District Governing Boards of the Taxing Districts vote to levy the minimum or maximum millages approved by voters to meet their expenses to deliver services.
- The Livingston Parish Assessor values property based on fair and equitable real estate sales, and records that value in the official roll as required by R.S. 47:2322.
- Once the Taxing Districts set rates, your property tax is calculated and the Sheriff's Office sends you a bill. Taxes are due by December 31 of each year.
